- 1. We need to speak where people can understand us.
- 2. Recounting one's obedience to Christ may teach, help, and encourage others.
- 3. Some places will not receive the truth.
- 4. The world often makes false allegations against God's children.
- 5. Citizenship in a great land is important—but citizenship in the kingdom of God is more valuable than all earthly citizenships.
- 6. May we teach according to the "perfect manner" of the gospel.
- In God's will there are "things which are appointed for you to do." Acts 22:10
- 8. To whom will the Lord send you? Acts 22:21
- 9. May there be a faithful Ananias for every lost Saul and soul.
- 10. The Lord will stand by the side of His faithful Christians.
- 11. Sincere motives do not justify any particular action.
- 12. If an audience feels a common bond with the speaker, they will be more likely to listen to him.
- 13. Sound reasoning is good . . . but do not leave out the Scriptures.
- 14. No matter how we present the message of God, not everyone will accept it.
- 15. We must faithfully and responsible present the Good News and leave the results to God.
- 16. Often there are increased opportunities to teach others, even in face of opposition.
- 17. If someone around us says, "I didn't know you were a Christian," then we have failed to represent Christ as we should.
- 18. The Lord has a will for His people.
- 19. Many all around us need to arise and be baptized, and wash away their sins. Acts 22:16
- 20. Even when one is bound, the truth in his heart is still free.
