

Nazareth



- Location of Nazareth:
 - In a basin on the north side of the Jezreel valley.
 - About 20 miles east of the Mediterranean Sea.
 - About 15 miles west of the south end of the Sea of Galilee.
 - 1,300 feet above sea level.
- Sights to be seen from the heights of Nazareth include:
 - To the north: Mount Hermon.
 - To the South: Jezreel Valley.
 - To the East: Mount Tabor.
 - To the west: Mount Cannel
- It is not mentioned in the Old Testament.
- Nazareth is first mentioned in **Matthew 2:23** - "And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, 'He shall be called a Nazarene.'"
- Jesus grew up in Nazareth and remained there for approximately the first thirty years of His life.
- Nazareth is where the angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she was to be the mother of Jesus. **Luke 1:26-35**
- Joseph brought Mary and the young child Jesus to Nazareth after leaving Egypt. **Matthew 2:19-33**
- Jesus taught in the synagogue and the people were ready to throw Him off of the brow of the hill. **Luke 4:16-30**
- Jesus was also known as Jesus of Nazareth because of his long association with the town. **Luke 24:19; John 1:45; Acts 2:22; Acts 3:6**

- **John 1:46** - “And Nathanael said to him, ‘Can anything good come out of Nazareth?’ Philip said to him, ‘Come and see.’”
 - **John 19:19** - “Now Pilate wrote a title and put it on the cross. And the writing was: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS.”
