Mechanical instruments of music were introduced by what was quickly to become the Roman Catholic Church

Roman Catholicism introduces the use of the organ as accompaniment in worship

16TH CENTURY

A.D.

Mechanical instrumental accompaniment in worship was unanimously opposed by all the great Reformation leaders

JOHN WESLEY - "I have no objections to instruments of music in our chapels, provided they are neither heard nor seen"

JOHN CALVIN - "Musical instruments in celebrating the praises of God would be no more suitable than the burning of incense, the lighting of lamps, and the restoration of the other shadows of the law."



THE NEW TESTAMENT CHURCH REMAINS TRUE TO SINGING WITHOUT MECHANICAL INSTRUMENTAL ACCOMPANIMENT!
