- 4. Upon hearing Peter's sermon, they were "pricked in their heart." Acts 2:37
- 5.7 They asked Peter what they needed to do to be forgiven of their sins. Acts 2:37
- 6. Peter told them to:
 - "Repent" Acts 2:38
 - "Be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins." Acts 2:38
- 7. They that gladly received his word were baptized." Acts 2:41
- 8. About 3,000 were added to the church that day. Acts 2:41, 47
- 9. They continued steadfastly in:
