“DO”

Acts 16:19-31



WHAT MUST I DO?

- I must not imagine that there is nothing for me to do.
- I must not put off doing what I am supposed to do.
- I must not wait for God to do for me what I can and must do for myself. God has done His part, and now He expects me to do mine.
- I must not wait for some peculiar feeling to authenticate my salvation. Nowhere in the Bible do we read, “He that feels all right shall be saved.” However, we do read, “He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. Mark 16:16
- I must not wait for the plan of Salvation to change to better suit me. It won't! I must change to better suit it.
- I must not leave my personal salvation in the hands of someone else.
- I must not try to include anything in my salvation that is not in the Bible . . . And I must not leave anything out of my salvation that is included in the Bible.
- I must not consult what man teaches in the matter, but what God teaches.
