Denominational Baptism is Wrong Because . . .

## IT HAS THE WRONG CONFESSION

- The denominational confession, "God for Christ's sake has pardoned my sins" prior to baptism, is unscriptural.
- Beleiving one's sins have been forgiven before the blood of Christ is reached (in Biblical baptism) is wrong.



THE BIBLE TEACHES . . .

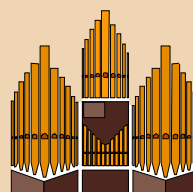
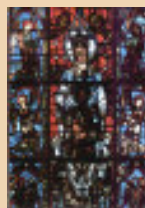
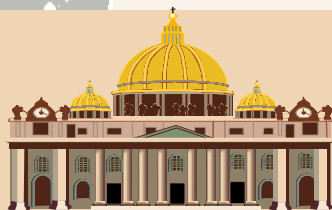


☞ The proper confession to precede baptism is, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God."
