Wise Men Sought Jesus -Wise Men Still Do

Matthew 2:1-11

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Lesson Text: Matthew 2:1-11
 - 1. At His birth: The question was asked: "Where is He that is born King of the Jews?"
 - 2. At His death: The sign above the cross read "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews"
 - a. Jesus grew up in Nazareth.
 - b. Jesus was the "King of kings and Lord of lords."
 - c. People today still need to know about Him . . . Where He is . . . And why.
- B. There is much we do not know about these men:
 - 1. How many men were there?
 - 2. What country or countries were they from?
 - 3. How far did they travel?
 - 4. What were their names?
 - 5. Were they Jews or Gentiles?
 - 6. How old was Jesus when the wise men arrived in Bethlehem? A few days . . . weeks . . . months . . . Two years . . . Etc.
- C. Tradition has spoken loudly where the Scriptures have remained silent.
 - 1. Tradition has assigned a number: Three
 - 2. Tradition has assigned their names:
 - a. Baltasar . . . King of Arabia
 - b. Gaspar . . . King of India
 - c. **Melchior** . . .King of Persia
 - 3. Tradition has assigned their country: Parthia
- D. Let us observe four things:
 - 1. What they **SOUGHT**.
 - 2. What they THOUGHT.
 - 3. What they **BROUGHT**.
 - 4. What they **TAUGHT**.

WHAT THEY SOUGHT.

- A. Their question: "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews?"
 - Matthew 2:2
 - 1. A Man "Where is He"
 - 2. A Monarch "Born King"
 - 3. A Messiah "Of the Jews"
- B. Their quest:

- 1. Their quest was a response to **revelation** . . . "We have seen"
- 2. Their guest involved **adoration** . . . "We are come to worship"

WHAT THEY THOUGHT.

- A. They substituted **REASON** for **REVELATION**. 2:1-2
 - (Which took them to Jerusalem and Herod)
- B. They substituted **REVELATION** for **REASON**. 2:10-11
 - (Which took them to Bethlehem and Christ)

WHAT THEY BROUGHT.

- A. **Gold** . . . A gift for a mighty **King**.
- B. Frankincense . . . A gift for a ministering Priest.
- C. Myrrh . . . A gift for a martyred Prophet.

WHAT THEY TAUGHT.

- A. Some who are far away find Christ before some who are nearer.
- B. The find is well worth every effort of the search. Finding Christ is worth all the effort one puts forth.
 - 1. Matthew 7:7 "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you."
 - 2. Matthew 6:33 "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you."
- C. Never substitute **REASON** for **REVELATION**.
 - 1. Never let what you think override what God has revealed.
 - 2. Never let your preferences override the stated will of God.
 - 3. Attitude: "None of self and all of Thee"
 - 4. What God has said is far more important . . . Eternally more important than what we think, feel, or desire.
