- A. D. 30** { From the beginning of the Church until the 5th century, the church sang without the accompaniment of mechanical instruments.
- 5th CENTURY A.D.** { Mechanical instruments of music were introduced by what was quickly to become the Roman Catholic Church. The opposition was so great that it was discontinued for the next five or six centuries.
- 5th CENTURY A.D.** { Roman Catholicism introduces the use of the organ as accompaniment in worship.
- 16th CENTURY A.D.** { Mechanical instrumental accompaniment in worship was unanimously opposed by all the great reformation leaders.
