

Seeing the New Testament in Relationship to the Old Testament

- The Matthew through John correspond to the Pentateuch in showing the need for the Savior and foreshadowing His coming in type and prophecy.
- The Acts of the Apostles present the early history of God's redeeming people, the church. They thus correspond to the historical books of the Old Testament—especially Joshua and Judges.
- The twenty-one epistles of the New Testament expound the meaning of Christ's redemption in Christian life. In this way they correspond to the Old Testament prophetic writings.
- The book of Revelation corresponds in part to the books of Daniel and Zechariah and the last thirteen chapters of Ezekiel. —
