

The Church - The Called Out

CHURCH - FROM GREEK WORD "EKKLESIA"

- **"Ek"** - a preposition
 - Prepositions show relationships
 - "Ek" primarily means "out of"
 - **"KLESIA"** - the verb "kaleo" with a modified spelling
 - Verbs show action
 - "Klesia" means "to call"
 - **"EK"** and **"KALEO"** together form a noun
 - A noun is the name of something
 - **"EKKLESIA"** means "That which is called out of"
- In ancient Greece,
- "Ekklesia" had special reference to the calling of certain citizens to service as jurors in court cases
